Reading Bookmarks

Reading bookmarks have started coming home with children in their reading records / reading books. These bookmarks are there to support you at home and will help build up your child's fluency and comprehension when reading.

Each bookmark (apart from Turquoise and above) have tricky words for that phase on one side and on the other side there are a range of questions to help support your child.

If your child moves up a book band, they will receive a new bookmark for the phase they are reading from.

Children receive two reading school books – one is a phonet–ically decodable book and one is a challenge book. If your child is on Phase 5 and above, they will receive two books from that phase.


















These books can be bought from a local independent bookstore, WHSmiths or Amazon. You might even find some in the local library.
